RABBI'S REFLECTIONS

Rabbi Jeffrey Kurtz-Lendner, August 2021

"The holidays are early this year." Haven't we heard that before? "Is Hanukkah early or late?" Well, actually, no, the holidays are NOT early this year. They are on the first of Tishrei, just like every other year. And Hanukkah is ALWAYS on the 25th —the 25th of Kislev. When I'm in the mood for a tongue-in-cheek comment, when people ask me if Hanukkah is early or late, I'll say,

"it's the same as always – the 25th of Kislev. But there's another holiday that others celebrate involving a tree and a man with a beard – sometimes that holiday comes around the 25th of Kislev but sometimes it happens well into the month of Tevet. How can anyone keep track of when it is?"

Having said all of that, this year Rosh Hashanah begins on Labor Day – the evening of Monday, September 6. For most of us that does indeed seem early. And, in fact, for a rabbi who has to prepare sermons, it DEFINITELY seems early.

Last year celebrating Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, like everything else last year, was completely out of the ordinary. This year is still abnormal, although we are beginning to see a light at the end of the tunnel. Depending on the specific circumstances of Covid at the time of Rosh Hashanah, in all likelihood there will be some return to services in person. I placed a caveat on this only because there is still uncertainty in regards to the variant and we don't know for certain what conditions will be like in September. Assuming that we are at least partially back in person we will continue to have the streaming option and, as you know, I will be participating on the large screen from my home in Pittsburgh. I think that the option of virtual services will remain with us a long time. Congregations nationwide have been able to engage members virtually who previously experienced limitations on attending in person.

On another note, if by chance you missed the email announcements, I want to let you know of the various adult education classes being offered. There are several weekly class offerings. If you are still interested in joining any of them, please let me know so I can send you a link and you will be welcome to join at any time.

Let us hope and pray that the summer continues to progress well and that the beginnings of the return to normalcy also continue. And let the time be near when the reality of Covid is nothing more than a memory.
