Andy reported that Faith in Action is closing in on the plan for a goal of Affordable
Housing. The Jewish Advocacy Day will be February 5th, and they will be charging \$36 per
person, for the trip to Richmond.

the fall semester. Josh Shulruff will fill in for the interim. Additionally, the Jewish Sorority is
disintegrating and Josh is actively encouraging these sorority students to run for Hillel officers,

## MY (MONTHLY) WORD!

# "On My 60th Bar Mitzvah Anniversary: A Random Reminiscence and a Far-From-Random Observation"

February begins with the Torah reading of *Bo*, the portion I read on February 6, 1960 when I was called to the bimah as a Bar Mitzvah at the Hebrew Tabernacle of Washington Heights (FYI, these anniversaries are commemorated on the day the *same Torah portion* is read, not the date).

I'll never forget that day. I knew my stuff but I was still nervous. A few days before the ceremony, my Aunt Tessy said to me, "Peter, whatever you do, don't look at me." What do you do when someone says that? Of course...you look! I was going through the ritual of putting on the talit for the first time, a very solemn moment in my congregation. My knees were shaking. As I was reciting the blessing I looked up at my aunt. As only she could, she stuck out her tongue, opened her eyes so that they appeared like saucers. It took everything in my power not to laugh out loud, but my nervousness was over.

She was like that...and no one can figure out how her son became a rabbi because on top of her humor she was virulently anti-synagogue. When her funeral was held in our congregation, someone said in a stage whisper, "Well, that's one way to get Tessy into schul"

But I digress.

In speaking about "covenant" to our two B'nai Mitzvah, I said, "At birth you have little choice as to whether you'll accept the covenant, but that's not the case at Bar Mitzvah." I went on, "Well, that's not really true. You do have a choice but your parents will have veto power!"

I wanted to know what they were looking forward to regarding this major rite-of-passage they will soon celebrate. I expected them to respond, "the party," or "the gifts." I had to pinch myself when they answered with great enthusiasm, "Oh, after Bar Mitzvah we can teach in our religious school." WHERE AM I???? I've NEVER heard that across almost 48 years as a rabbi, and I offer kudos to Dara and Liz and the entire religious school for instilling this most positive perspective in our children. Wow!

Bar/Bat Mitzvah offers the opportunity for Jewish children to begin to think about the true meaning of covenant. Cai and Troy are on the right path! (Oh, one more thing I recall....when my rabbi was about to bless me, he whispered, "Hey, bend down a little, Peter, I can't reach your head!")
