FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

"Another Word, This One Especially For the Parents and Grandparents of Our Middle School and High School Students ...(But You Can Read it Too!)"

There's one very fine, bright and Jewishly-dedicated young woman who is in my Confirmation "class" in Virginia. Her name is Hannah Lovinger. She lives in Bridgewater. There are two Jewish students in her High School. While she had felt uncomfortable on occasion, her strength of character and strength of faith never let the questions, looks and attitudes cause her to hide her identity. I asked to see her college essay (the kids in Harrisonburg's congregation are in grade 12 when they are confirmed) in which she wrote about how one of the newest camps of the Union for Reform Judaism, Six Points in North Carolina, helped her strengthen her identity even more.

In the meantime I received the catalogue of the Jewish Studies Program of Indiana University in Bloomington. Why I'm on their list I do not know but I was so glad to read their offerings...so glad and so surprised. When I went through the extensive catalogue it was enough to make me want to go back to college (noooo, not really); in any case, it was enough to make me want to take some of their classes and listen-in to the lectures, etc.

"The Jew Who Would Be King: One Man's Quest for a Crown in Africa"

"We Renounce Hymns: Form and Voice in American Yiddish Holocaust Poetry"

"Sex, Segregation and Women's Exclusion: Israel's New Civil Rights Frontier"

"Jews and the American South: Race, Religion, Region"

I'm sharing this with you, **especially parents of middle- and high school students who are** beginning to think about where to attend college. It's good for our kids to find a college that has something that attracts Jewish students similar to the offerings at Indiana University.

There's a combination of factors here:

Where our offspring attend camp (under non-Covid circumstances) and where they attend college. As an alumnus of our URJ camp in Great Barrington, Massachusetts, I cannot begin to tell you how life-changing the experience was for me, a Jewish teen from Manhattan where even in my Washington Heights neighborhood the non-Jews often think they were Jewish. How much the more so someone like Hannah – and your child and grandchild – who live in the Shenandoah Valley, beautiful but not exactly a Jewish haven!

Where our offspring attend college. Those are the years that our sociologists say are "lost" to religion unless they find themselves in a welcoming environment, one that has a large-ish Jewish population and inspirational and enticing programming.

The energy of rabbis, cantors and educators has been directed – for decades now – to strengthening the Jewish identity of our young people. They need a place where they can feel comfortable, learn more about their faith and culture, and, yes, perhaps meet a future mate.

Check out the URJ camps, research the colleges and universities that have Jewish Studies programs. Oh, yes, don't forget to also investigate the BIRTHRIGHT program that pays for young adults to visit Israel. That's a topic for another time.
