A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, report from the board 5/20/19

Although summer is approaching, we remain busy at Beth El. Please know a separate summer calendar is in the works and will be available soon. Summer Shabbat potlucks organized by Mary Handley will resume on Friday, June 7 @ 6:30.

Beth El was well represented at the recent *Many Voices of Harrisonburg* event, including Dara, Danielle, & Madeline Hall as the Jewish contingency for Peace Camp. (Please contact Dara if you want more information about Peace Camp.)

The 2019-2020 budget was passed. We endorsed a one-time security surcharge to address additional security expenses. The trustees have met to formulate specific plans and additions to our existing systems, some of which will require a change in our awareness and approach. We will continue to update the congregation as plans are enacted. We recognize that security is a complex endeavor and that we have a range of perspectives regarding security within the Beth El Community. With this in mind, we are taking the advice of trained law enforcement individuals such as Sgt. Grubbs of the Harrisonburg Police Department who recently led our safety workshop. The roof has been fixed. Thank you to Stu Liss for your diligence.

The social action committee spoke about about HIAS, a Jewish non-profit with a long history of helping refugees. A link to the organization should be on our website. Ron motioned that we make a \$36 donation to the organization of Linda Kohen's choice in honor of Linda's service on the board. Andy Kohen reported that Faith in Action continues to with their agenda, in particular, they are trying to reform the local criminal justice system. The board voted to support a Kalunu speaker this year. Eric Kramer has volunteered to coordinate the event.

Men's Club Les reports that they cooked spaghetti for the Friendship Church Ministries recently with a great turnout of volunteers from Beth El. We will have another opportunity to do this again in the Fall. The corned beef sales went well. The next Men's Club meeting will be on June 19. The current leadership will continue for the Men's Club for an additional year. Sisterhood purchased children's toys with a swimming/ beach theme as a donation to First Step, and Becky Mintzer delivered the items.

Religious School celebrated its last day with a picnic and Lag B'Omer games at Oakdale Park.

We will continue with transitions this year as we say goodbye to Rabbi Ben and welcome to Rabbi Grumbacher. Please know that there are many opportunities to get involved, share your expertise, or simply just help out. I will be posting specific areas of needed help throughout the year:
