A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT, From the Board April 20, 2020

- Rabbi Grumbacher joined our Zoom meeting from Delaware and led the opening prayer.
 His perspective on Temple events appears later in this report.
- Treasurer's Report: Bill Ney reports that expenses are high and income is low.
 I will add that it is crucial that anyone who has not paid his or her dues in full needs to do so at this time. Please contact Bill if you need to make an adjustment due to covid 19 impact.
- Building & Grounds Committee: Ron Ornstein reports that Mary Handley inquired if Vine and Fig could help with the clean-up in the back wooded area. The board was fine with this, as long as there would be no digging.
- Nominating Committee: Gratitude was expressed for the efforts of Cindy Baron, Roni Goldberg, and Andy Kohen for their efforts.
- Rabbi Search Committee: As we have engaged Rabbi Grumbacher for another year, the committee is temporarily on furlough. Andy expects to resume activity by filing a notice with the CCAR in late summer or early autumn.
- Social Action: We had a request for a member of Beth El to participate as Secretary for the Interfaith
 Association. If interested, please contact Andy Kohen or Linda Kohn. Andy reported that "the Faith in
 Action Campaign to promote Affordable Housing continues and it is likely to extend over a 2-year
 period. Obviously, publicizing it and meeting with local government officials about the Affordable
 Housing Trust Fund will be done differently than if face to face meetings and rallies were possible.
 Additional information provided by Linda regarding upcoming events will be sent out in a separate
 email.
- Men's Club: Les Mintzer reports that the Men's Club is scheduled to provide lunch at the Catholic church on June 11, 2020, but they are waiting to see if this will be permitted, as all of the May lunches have already been cancelled.
- Sisterhood: Gale Clemons reported that Sisterhood donated \$300 to the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank, and another \$100 to First Step.
- Religious School: Closed until further notice.
- Old Business: Status of scheduled events (Excerpts from Rabbi Grumbacher):

We are beginning virtual Shabbat services this Friday (4/24). If this works, we'll Zoom every other week or so. Your comments to me would be deeply appreciated as it's difficult to know congregants' feelings about this most unusual type of worship. It's also hard to have a delicious oneg Shabbat. Adult Education may be on hold. I've been working with Troy Kramer twice a week with the assumption that the Bar Mitzvah would be postponed until September. They asked to have it on the assigned date which is ok with me. I'll take all precautions as will they. So all things being equal (and who knows what that means nowadays), we will have the Bar Mitzvah on the scheduled date of May 30th. There will be a maximum of 10 people in the sanctuary; others may Zoom from afar. The time is also up-in-the-air for a few reasons. It will probably take place around 2:00. (While there was concern voiced by some, the board deferred to Rabbi Grumbacher, coordinating with family members, in this decision). We might have Confirmation later that day . Confirmands are Grace Miller and Owen Harris.

As you know, I've sent a daily My Word! with an attached joke. I'm not sure which the congregants like more, but I know that among other reasons writing daily gives me one more thing to do at home. (Several board members stated their appreciation of Rabbi Grumbacher's daily articles.) I've called the names on the membership list twice since this isolation began. Many times I've had to leave voice

MY (MONTHLY) WORD!

"Let's Not Have to Call 1. 8 0 0. G A M B L E R"

The morning service in the prayerbook contains two important blessings, the first thanking God for the intricate manner in which our bodies were created, the second for giving the Torah. We read in the first, "Blessed is our Eternal God...who has made our bodies with wisdom, combining veins, arteries and vital organs into a finely balanced network. Wondrous...Source of our health...,we give You thanks and praise."It is actually more descriptive, but you get the point. In the second we read, "Blessed is the Eternal...who hallows us with mitzvot...(M)ake the words of Your Torah sweet to us...that we and our children may be...students of Your Torah. Blessed is the Eternal, the Teacher of Torah to (our) people Israel." It's not the content that I'm pointing out, it's the order. Isn't Torah supreme over everything other than God? Of course it is! However we know – or we should know – that health precedes even Torah study, Torah knowledge. Why? Because you cannot worship God and you cannot fulfill the commandments if you do not have your health. You cannot work, you cannot sustain your family, you cannot create for the good of society, you cannot manufacture, sell, buy, assist, respond when your health is compromised. That is why these calls to Get America to Work Again, or however they are verbalized, is nothing morethan a gamble, and gamblers should call 1.800.GAMBLER!

Of course everyone wants our economy to bounce back ("bounce" it's not going to do); and we want our schools, universities, small and large businesses, factories and everything else for that matter, functioning. But what good will that be if the numbers of sick and dying will rise as a result? What good will it be if social distancing and the other precautions we've taken to ease this pandemic will have to begin again with even greater intensity because it was too early to return to normal? Will those who call for the liberation of Virginia and the other states see the light only when they or their loved ones (let'sjust say relatives) come down with the disease?

The Beth El community wants life to get back to normal as do all of our neighbors regardless of faith. We've got rites-of-passage; regular Shabbat worship; adult education - for heaven's sake, the education of our youth! - and the holydays to consider, but we cannot assume normalcy under these current conditions. We will have to be very creative as we move forward, praying that we'll be able to

congregate in short order, using our brains to do our share to make that happen. Don't gamble on COVID-19; don't gamble with your health!
