A Message from our Rabbi

Tu Bishvat falls this year on Monday, February 6. The Mishnah states that the 15th day of the month of Shevat is the "Rosh Hashanah of the Trees" – the "New Year of the Trees."

Here in our country we are taught that part of being a good citizen is taking care of the environment. We should recycle bottles, use grocery bags again before we throw them out, and put trash where it belongs. Recycling paper helps us save trees.

There is a story from the Talmud that says:

Honi the Circle Maker was walking on the road and saw a man planting a carob tree. Honi asked the man, "How long will it take for this tree to bear fruit?"

The man replied, "Seventy years."

Honi then asked the man, "And do you think you will live another seventy years and eat the fruit of this tree?"

The man answered, "Perhaps not. However, when I was born into this world, I found many carob trees planted by my father and grandfather. Just as they planted trees for me, I am planting trees for my children and grandchildren so they will be able to eat the fruit of these trees."

The idea from the Mishnah that the trees would have a Rosh Hashanah, a New Year – affirms that Jewish tradition has recognized for thousands of years that being a good citizen means to take care of our environment. The man from the Talmud also taught us the idea that when we use something we have to replace it. When we use nature we have to restore nature for those who come after us.

In Israel today, Israel is the only country in the entire world that has more trees now than it did 100 years ago. We

learn from our tradition that taking care of the environment is not a new idea. Recycling isn't a new concept of the twenty-first century, but was taught to us by our sages and rabbis for thousands of years.

Being a good citizen means taking care of the environment. Being a good Jew means taking care of the environment.

And we honor Tu Bishvat by planting trees so that, as Honi recognized in the time of the Talmud, a healthy environment will be there for the next generation just as it has been here for us.
