During the month of November we celebrate one of the most universally American observed holidays – Thanksgiving. We take it as a time to give thanks for family and friends and all that we have in our lives.

Unfortunately, the events that have happened in Israel have been incredibly distressing to us. For Jews in America, the feelings we have had since the events of October 7 resemble the feelings we had over the 9-11 attacks—fear, concern, worry, sadness. For American Jews, we are taking the events overseas far more personally than most of our fellow Americans. Those events may make it seem difficult to be able to feel thankful at this time. So many of us have friends and family in Israel. We are only a degree or two away from someone who has been directly affected by this tragedy.

Nevertheless I want to offer encouragement to find opportunities for gratitude. If we allow the tragic events that have happened to overshadow every aspect of our lives, and if we allow that to cause us to live our lives in despair, then that only gives another victory to the terrorists. Their joy comes not only from inflicting pain on the victims, but of creating uncertainty and crisis in Israel. And if that sense of crisis pervades the world wide Jewish community, then that only enhances their own satisfaction.

We should not forget or abandon the ongoing struggles of those directly affected by the crisis, and we should offer our support to the organizations providing life saving care to the victims and their families. But we can also take time to feel gratitude in our lives. We can feel grateful for the very small relief that comes from the few hostages who have been released. We can find gratitude in our local Jewish community. Coming together, we comfort each other. We are also comforted by the expressions of concern and solidarity that we have heard from other members of the Harrisonburg community.

But most importantly, we should find the gratitude of being surrounded by our closest friends and the families with whom we share love. Even in dark hours we can find sparks of gratitude.

Let our Thanksgiving this year help us to find those sparks of gratitude.
